# MONTHLY LEADERSHIP MEETING WITH DR. SUSAN HAYWARD

On October 10<sup>th</sup>, Fritz Schermbeck, Jason Schreiner and I met with Dr. Hayward, Mr. Davis, Mr. Fouke, and Mrs. Novak. Topics discussed included:

<u>Technology Issues/Concerns:</u> Insight and feedback offered by Tammy Conlan and Wendy McCall. Problems with the speed of the network, connectivity, Learning.com, and Schoolnet were addressed. Dr. Hayward is making our technology issues a priority and will begin working to resolve them.

### HIGH SCHOOL SCHEDULE UPDATE



Dr. Hayward indicated that she is still researching high school schedules by looking at a variety of information and research, which includes Nurses in every building/partnership with
Promedica: Dr. Hayward will be meeting with
Promedica this week to take our advocacy for
having a nurse in every building to them to support
us with funding one for our remaining buildings.
This would be a similar program to TPS.

Sex Education Curriculum at the Junior High: The Sex Ed. curriculum in 8th grade Jr. High Health class will focus on an abstinence program. Thanks to the work of Tina Dake, Brett Herr, and Karen Campbell for collaborating and designing the curriculum that was clarified and supported by TAWLS at the meeting.

ESSA/Cultural Competencies: TAWLS is partnering with the OEA, NEA, and Montgomery Institute for Torian and I to bring in a comprehensive professional development program to help understand our socio-economic groups and how to teach/serve them. Due to numerous other district initiatives we are working with Dr. Hayward to advance our district at this time the professional development will be brought to the high school as a pilot program this spring.

<u>TAWLS Visitations</u>: TAWLS shared and explained the purpose and role of the building visits to Dr. Hayward. This year visits will focus on how we can better serve you.

comparable school districts. Dr. Hayward indicated that she will make a decision by November and it will be based on what is best for kids. She has read and reviewed the data and suggestions/comments in our recent survey from the high school and greatly appreciated the input. I did not get any indication on her preference for a particular schedule, other than making a change. Any change, especially if there is a move to a 45-55 minute period schedule, plenty of professional development will be provided. Since the HS has been on block since 1999-2000, there are very few who have experienced a schedule other than the 4 block schedule, so providing professional development aids in easing any change. From the association position, the most important piece I

sought clarification, reassurance, and advocated on was staffing. Dr. Hayward was clear and reassured us that there will be no RIFs on any schedule change. A survey of high school teachers and feedback on preferred schedule is attached.
