TAULS Accomplishments 2012-2013

The 2012-2013 school year has been an amazing year for TAWLS. Beginning in fall 2012, we began with a vision of FORWARD TOGETHER, striving to embrace UNITY for TAWLS. Beside teachers, UNITY was achieved by working together with the community and district staff. This year we have accomplished:

1) CONTRACT - Negotiated a 2 year contract that includes a 3% increase to the base for next year

As mentioned in the last edition of "The Message," TAWLS was working to increase our presence in the community to celebrate 50 years as an association and to build unity and partnership within the community and association.

At the end of December 2012, TAWLS Treasurer Rhea Young, secured a deal through LAMAR Outdoor to display our 50th anniversary logo, and image developed by Brent Temple & Michael Punsalan, on three billboards around the community.

The three billboards were displayed for nearly two months near the intersections of Monroe & Sylvania, Alexis & Thetherwood, and Alexis near Clover.

In addition, the cost of the billboards were off set by securing a public relations grant through NWOEA.

In the year to come, TAWLS looks forward to building its relationship and partnership with the district by sponsoring a banner on the Whitmer Baseball Field which will continue for 5 years. Proceeds from the sponsorship will help the Whitmer Baseball program.



Strongsville Teachers Return After 8-Week Strike

STRONGSVILLE, Ohio -- Teachers returned to classrooms to exuberant hugs and smiles from their students after an eight-week strike. The teachers wasted no time getting back to teaching, which was interrupted March 4 when a strike began over benefits, raises and other issues.

There was a brief meeting in the Strongsville High School auditorium, before classes resumed at 7:20 a.m. Principal William Steffen read a statement that he said was being read district-wide. The statement began, "We need to take an active role to heal our district." Tracy Linscott, president of the 385-member Strongsville Education Association said Monday that the grueling strike was worth the effort, particularly in the non-monetary areas. "I really feel like as a group we gained" in the contract approved by teachers and the school board over the weekend, she said. "We were willing to give up our salary and benefits for eight weeks to fight for what we believe in.

"Superintendent John Krupinski says the district got what it needed -- a contract through mid-2015 that it can afford. The district gave some ground on "step" raises, which are based on years of experience and advanced degrees. "But that was balanced by extreme concessions by the bargaining unit in health care," Krupinski said. Strongsville teachers haven't gotten across-the-board raises since 2007-08, and didn't get step raises last school year.

Just before the strike began March 4, the

district proposed that the step freeze continue into 2015. The union wanted the freeze to end and onetime \$2,000 payments to be given to salary and benefits teachers whose experience and degrees put them beyond the steps. The final contract resumes the step increases, with payments of \$1,200 to teachers who aren't eligible for an increase. The final agreement has teachers paying 20 percent of the premiums with no maximums. However, the contribution drops to 15 percent, with monthly maximums, if teachers undergo required screenings and complete a health assessment.
